#### ALL THINGS ARE CONNECTED


#### WHAT IS IT?

The Medicine Wheel is the <u>foundation for teachings about</u> <u>walking on the earth in a good way.</u>

The term "medicine" does not refer to drugs or remedies.

The Medicine Wheel and its teachings <u>assist individuals</u> along the path toward mental, spiritual, emotional and <u>physical enlightenment</u>.

The Medicine Wheel is a representation of how all things in the natural world come in fours: <u>four directions</u>, <u>four seasons</u>, four stages of life, four basic elements.



## THE SHAPE

•Its circular shape expresses the belief in the <u>endless circle of life</u>

•It has 4 quadrants, usually <u>white</u>, <u>yellow</u>, <u>red</u> <u>and black</u> (sacred colours)

•Shows <u>balance</u> and <u>harmony</u> among all parts of the circle

Represents a cycle:

- The migration of the birds
- The cycle of the season
- The cycles of the moon
- Plants grow, produce seed, then die and return to the earth, seeds grow again in the spring



#### NORTH - WHITE

As we get older our hair turns <u>white</u>, as we come to our time of <u>winter</u>.


- With experience and age we gain <u>wisdom</u>.
- North is <u>purity</u> and wisdom.

The animals of the North are the <u>Moose</u> and <u>Bear</u>. They

rest and take things slow, not wasting energy, and with

the understanding of what winter brings.

Often symbolizes <u>death</u> and the <u>end of the life cycle</u>.





## EAST - YELLOW

The East represents <u>yellow</u>, the <u>beginning</u> and the <u>renewal</u>.

Beginnings start in the East, from where the <u>sun rises</u> to begin a new dawn.

Representative of <u>new ideas</u> and <u>seeing the light</u>, or a candle in the dark.

Spring is the season when all <u>things begin to grow</u> and awaken.

<u>Animals with wings</u> are typical representatives: the hummingbird, the owl, and the hawk.

Often associated with childhood and innocence.



#### SOUTH - RED


At the <u>peak of the Sun's journey</u> through the sky, the South is the <u>place that receives the</u> <u>most light.</u>

It is responsible for the growth and flowering of all living beings.

South is most often associated with the <u>flowing</u> of <u>emotions</u> as it is the polar opposite of the North.

It symbolizes <u>youth</u>, adolescence, <u>early adult</u> <u>life.</u>

Red is for <u>fire</u>, <u>passion</u>, <u>summer</u>, and a <u>time of</u> <u>fertility</u>.



#### WEST - BLACK

The West is a place of <u>sunset</u>, the <u>return to</u> <u>the dark</u>.

It is the <u>autumn</u> of our humanness – <u>a time of</u> <u>maturity.</u>

The West symbolizes a place of <u>transition</u> <u>from youth to late adulthood.</u>

Typical animals: <u>snake</u> - reminds us to shed our skin to grow and change. <u>Beaver</u> – working hard to prepare for coming winter.
