




Northwest Pacific Coast

- Lines: bold and strong and not jagged.
- Through the use of smooth and curving lines, clear boundaries and shapes are created.
- Bold contrasting colors are used in Native art which allows the areas of color to be obvious and clear.
- Traditionally, the colors used in northwest coast art are black and red with black being the primary color of the form line.

Haida style features:

- Ovoids
- U shape
- Split U shape
- S-shape
- Trigon
- Quadron



Eagle

- Ruler of the sky
- Symbolizes grace, power
- Has great intellectual abilities



Raven

- Part of the creation story (discovered mankind in a clamshell)
- Symbolizes change in life, creativity and humour



Bear

- Has great self awareness
- Able to deliberate about choices or actions
- Symbolizes family and strength



Beaver

- Has a great understanding of nature
- Works in harmony with his surroundings
- Symbolizes good work ethics, a strong will and protector and a strong sense of family



Whale

- Known to help people in need whether they are helpless or wounded
- Symbolizes kindness, intelligence and compassion
- Orcas are a symbol of romance as they mate for life



Frog

- A sign for people to put away the winter activities and prepare for a new season
- Symbolizes cleansing, peace and rebirth
- Often seen on house posts because they are believed to keep the house from falling over



Wolf

- Known for intelligence, leadership and strong sense of family values
- Great team player
- Symbolizes perseverance, intuition and success
- Also mates for life




Salmon

- Symbolizes instinct, determination and persistence
- Provider of life
- Salmon in pairs is good luck



Hummingbird

- Sends messages to the people of things to come
- Messages can be a spirit message or a message of healing
- Symbolizes beauty, intelligence and love



Owl

- Linked with wisdom, foresight and the keeper of sacred knowledge
- Great foreteller of weather conditions and can be observed to identify changes in environment



Thunderbird

- Giant supernatural bird who causes thunder and lightning
- Represents the carrying out of law and protocol

- Draw an animal of your choice in the Haida style and use it to create linoleum block prints
 - 1. Choose animal
 - 2. Sketch in Haida style, fill in areas that will be cut away
 - 3. Get teacher approval
 - 4. Sketch onto linoleum block
 - Carve image into linoleum block using techniques shown in class (subtractive method)
 - 6. Create prints using 3 styles (solid colour, off register, multicolour)
 - 7. Hand in your best print in each style
