
Surrealism

Surrealism

- Developed in Europe (mainly France, Germany and Belgium) in the 1920's, characterized by using the subconscious as a source of creativity to liberate pictorial subjects and ideas.
- Surrealist paintings often depict unexpected or irrational objects in an atmosphere of fantasy, creating a dreamlike scenario.
